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Good Trouble Lives On Organizers Partner with Rock the Vote for National Weekend of Action (July 17-19)

WASHINGTON D.C. — The organizations leading Good Trouble Lives On (July 17-19) have officially partnered with [Rock the Vote](#) for the sixth annual national weekend of nonpartisan nonviolent action. At goodtroubleliveson.org, eligible voters can now use the Good Trouble Lives On Rock the Vote Tool to [register to vote](#), [check their voting status](#), [get an absentee ballot](#) and [make the pledge to vote](#) to receive election dates and deadlines.

This year's Good Trouble Lives On action will be different from previous years. In remembrance of Congressman John Lewis, the weekend will be anchored through voter engagement, civic education and faith-based organizing, under the banner of "Teach! Reach! Preach!" The weekend will bring together grassroots organizations, legal advocates, faith leaders and community members for a unified collective push to register voters from historically underrepresented communities—including young people, Black and Brown voters, people with disabilities, people with low or no incomes, people experiencing homelessness, and others who continue to face barriers to civic participation.

"At a time when voting rights continue to face challenges across the country, partnering with Rock the Vote for the Good Trouble Lives On Weekend of Action is more important than ever," said **Jalisa Giles, coordinator for the Declaration for American Democracy Coalition**, housed under Public Citizen and a lead partner of GTLO. "Inspired by the late Congressman John Lewis's lifelong fight to protect the fundamental right to vote, this partnership reflects our shared commitment to ensuring every eligible voter has the opportunity to make their voice heard. Honoring his legacy means continuing the work of defending our democracy and expanding civic participation for generations to come."

"John Lewis taught us that democracy isn't something we inherit, it's something we have to protect and strengthen through action," said **Kenneth Sandoval-Bushur, senior advisor at**

Rock the Vote. “His legacy continues to inspire all of us at Rock the Vote and serves as a powerful reminder that ordinary people have the power to create extraordinary change when they organize, speak out, and show up for one another. We’re proud to join the Good Trouble Lives On Weekend of Action to honor Congressman Lewis by continuing the work he dedicated his life to: expanding participation, defending the freedom to vote, and empowering the next generation to make their voices heard.
